Analysis:

Liberal College, Luwangsangbam conducts regular teachers' feedback through the supply of questionnaire. Sample population of the survey is 71 (seventy-one) and there are seventy-one respondents. As far as the suitability of the syllabus to the course given in Q1 is concerned, it is responded that 15.94% of the teachers disagree, 15.9% neither agree nor disagree, 65.2% agree while 2.89% strongly agree. Regarding the need base of the syllabus given in Q2, it is responded that 1.45% strongly disagree, 13% disagree, 15.94% neither agree nor disagree, 65.2% agree while 2.9% strongly agree.

Aims and Objects of the syllabi are well defined and dear to teachers and students in Q3. It is responded that 11.42% disagree, 12.8% neither agree nor disagree, 70% agree while 5.7% strongly agree. Course content is followed by corresponding reference materials given Q4. It is responded that 8.57% disagree, 30% neither agree nor disagree, 57% agree while 4.2% strongly agree. The availability of sufficient books in the library given in Q5, it is responded that 5.7% strongly disagree, 38.6% disagree, 24.3% neither agree nor disagree, 27% agree while 4.3% strongly agree.

Good balancing between theory and application of the course syllabus, it is responded that 2.86% strongly disagree, 11.4% disagree, 20% neither agree nor disagree, 61.4% agree while 4.3% strongly agree. The response of the teachers who has been made interested in the subject area of the course syllabus, 4.29% disagree, 17.1% neither agree nor disagree, 68.6% agree while 10% strongly agree. Q8, the course

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syllabus of the subject increases my knowledge and perspective in the subject area, it is responded that 5.7% strongly disagree, 10% disagree, 67% neither agree nor disagree.
