1. **A BRIEF PROFILE :**

The LIBERAL COLLEGE, Luwangsangbam, established in 1979, is the outcome of the long-cherished will and desire of the people in the area. This institution was named "LIBERAL COLLEGE" unanimously in a historic public meeting presided over by the then Hon'ble MLA, Heingang Assembly Constituency, Shri L. Ningthemjao Singh, convened on June 3, 1979, along with the four Pradhans of Gram Panchayats of the Heingang Assembly Constituency, namely (i) Shri Md. Asraf Ali, Heingang G.P. (ii) Shri Y. Kalachand Singh, Laipham Khunou G.P. (iii) Shri P. Mangi Singh, Kontha Khabam G.P., and (iv) Shri Y. Mangi Singh, Luwangsangbam G.P., at the premises of Srivan High School, Luwangsangbam. The college is about 7 km away towards the northern side of Imphal City and the western side of National Highway No. 2. The first regular classes started on August 10, 1979, at the premises of Srivan High School, Luwangsangbam.

The foundation stone of the college was laid by Sri R.K. Dorendro Singh, the then Hon'ble Chief Minister of Manipur, on October 19, 1980. The location of the college in a beautiful landscape far away from the din and bustle of the city provides a very good and sound academic atmosphere for various courses of study. The college has also been included in 2(f) and 12-B under Section 2(f) of the UGC Act 1956 vide UGC Orders No. F. 8/28/95 (CPP-I) dated 19-02-98.

Liberal College opens classes for Bachelor of Arts, Science, and Commerce under the National Education Policy 2020 (NEP 2020). The college has been permanently affiliated with Manipur University, Canchipur, w.e.f. 27/03/1992 up to Undergraduate III Year Arts, Science, and Commerce, vide M.U. Orders No. MU/2-1/180/CDC/4755 dated 27/03/92. The college was registered under the Society Registration Act XXI of 1960, having its Registration No. 4408 of 1983, and was run by the Governing Body. It has proved its existence for the last 45 years, during which the pace of development and expansion of the college has been rapid and significant due to the dedicated services rendered by all the stake-holders of the college.

Acknowledging the service rendered by the college to the needy people of society, the Government of Manipur converted the college into a full-fledged government college vide its cabinet decision held on March 28, 2017.

3. SCHEME OF STUDIES

Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) with Learning Outcome based Curriculum Framework (LOCF)

Course Structure for B.A, BSc, BCom (Programme) followed in the College is approved by the Ordinance for Undergraduate Programme in Science, Arts and Commerce, 2021 by the Manipur University. The course structure of the undergraduate programme is as follows:

A. Bachelor's Certificate

The Bachelor's Certificate in a discipline is obtainable after 1 year (two semesters) of study. A Bachelor's Certificate in a discipline may be awarded if a student studies 4 core papers in that discipline, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), 2 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) and 4 Value Addition Courses (VAC), with the completion of courses equal to a minimum of 46 Credits.

B. Bachelor's Diploma

The Bachelor's Diploma in a discipline is obtainable after 2 years (four semesters) of study. A Bachelor's Diploma in a discipline may be awarded if a student studies 10 core papers in that discipline, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses



(AECC), 2 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), 6 Value Addition Courses (VAC) and 2 Generic Elective courses (GEC), with the completion of courses equal to a minimum of 96 Credits.

C. Bachelor's Degree

The Bachelor's Degree in a discipline is obtainable after 3 years (six semesters) of study. A Bachelor's degree (i.e., B.Sc./ B.A./ B.Com.) in a discipline degree may be awarded if a student studies 14 core papers in that discipline, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), 2 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), 8 Value Addition Courses (VAC), 2 Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) courses and 4 Generic Elective (GE) courses, with the completion of courses equal to a minimum of 140 Credits.

D. Bachelor's Degree with Honours

The Bachelor's Degree with Honours in a discipline is obtainable after 4 years (eight semesters) of study. A Bachelor's degree with Honours (i.e., B.Sc.(Honours)/ B.A. (Honours)/ B.Com. (Honours)) in a discipline may be awarded if a student studies 18 core papers in that discipline, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), 2 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), 8 Value Addition Courses (VAC), 4 Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) and 6 Generic Elective courses (GEC), with the completion of courses equal to a minimum of 180 Credits.

There are a total of eighteen core courses in every program that students are required to take across eight semesters. All the core courses are compulsory. In addition to core courses, a student in the BA/BSc program will choose four Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) courses, six Generic Elective Courses (GEC), and eight value addition courses.

The Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) courses are offered in the last four semesters of the 4-year undergraduate program, namely the fifth, sixth, seventh, and eighth semesters. One such course will be selected by a student for each of these semesters from a set of specified courses (Group I and II in the attached table). Further, the DSE courses for the fifth and seventh semesters should be selected from the list of courses in Group I, and for the sixth and eighth semesters from the list in Group II. It is recommended that each college should include at least three Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) courses in each group list to allow students some minimal element of choice.

The Generic Elective (GE) courses, which are meant for students of other departments, are offered from the 3rd semester through the 8th semester (see enclosed separate table). Students are required to take six GE courses during the entire program, one per semester from the 3rd semester to the 8th semester.



There are two compulsory papers for every student in the first and second semesters: AECC-01 (English/MIL) and AECC-02 (EVS), respectively.

Mark distribution and Evaluation

Total marks for each course shall be based on Internal assessment (25%) and semester end examination (75%). The internal assessment of 25 % shall be distributed as under

- (i) Test/ Assignment/Seminar/Field work/Project work/ Case Study : 20 %
- (ii) Attendance 5%

7. CAMPUS FACILITIES:

Computer Class :

The college is running special computer awareness classes for freshers in the first semester. The college is also offering a vocational Data Entry Operator course under the IT Enabled Service Sector as part of the PMKVY Scheme. Students can enroll in this course to study the basics of computer applications.

Library :

The college has a well-stocked academic library that offers a wide range of textbooks, reference materials, additional resources, and special documents for students and teachers across different faculties and academic disciplines. The library provides various types of newspapers, bulletins, periodicals, magazines, journals, and numerous information technology resources to support and enhance the academic careers of all students. Additionally, the library features well-organized reading rooms and urinal/lavatory facilities for both students and staff.

The college library consistently supplies all the essential books and other resource materials prescribed by Manipur University and recommended by the college's teachers. The library also plans to maintain and expand its infrastructure to include modern information technology, such as computers, televisions, and other audio-visual aids.

Vehicle Shed :The college has a large and well-constructed vehicle shed for parking various types of vehicles, including bicycles, two-wheelers, and four-wheelers. This facility provides convenience to students and employees during class and office hours. The vehicle shed is well-fenced and guarded with tight security, monitored by CCTV cameras and a chowkidar during office hours, ensuring the general safety of the student community and employees.

Student's Union Office, Boy's and Girl's Common Rooms :

The college has a well-constructed Student Union Office and separate Common Rooms for both boys and girls. These facilities are well-equipped with newspapers, periodicals, magazines, first-aid medical treatment, and various indoor games.

Hostel :
